
Dear Mr. Covar:

The Alamo Area Council of Governments wishes to advise TCEQ that it supports the position of the local governments (see attached resolution) for the matter of the Post Oak Municipal Solid Waste Landfill permit application. Therefore, AACOG requests its letter dated January 27, 2011 be withdrawn from the Application, Parts 1 and 2.

In reviewing the application, AACOG considers 1) consistency with the AACOG Regional MSW Management Plan and 2) the local government's support or non-support of the proposed facility. AACOG has always supported the local government's position. On Tuesday, June 26, 2012, Guadalupe County Commissioners Court withdrew its support of the facility. The AACOG determines that local support is more important than consistency with its plan in the future operation of any permitted facility.

**A RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION OF THE POST OAK CLEAN GREEN LANDFILL**

**WHEREAS**, the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer is one of the State's major aquifers and this aquifer is now being developed as a major source of water due to the increasing population along the IH-35 and IH-10 corridors; and

**WHEREAS**, this area is in the recharge zone for the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer; and

**WHEREAS**, various water companies have plans for additional wells for production of groundwater from both the Carrizo formation and the adjacent Wilcox formation (the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer) in Guadalupe and/or Gonzales Counties; and

**WHEREAS**, the preservation of the groundwater quality and the long-term availability of groundwater as a reliable source of publicly supplied water defines the county's most immediate interest; and


**WHEREAS**, the proposed landfill may pose a threat to both the quality and long-term availability of groundwater upon which many residents rely upon as their source of drinking water; and


**WHEREAS**, the proposed landfill's proximity to many abandoned oil and gas wells with deteriorating well casings could with a single accident, storm event, failure of a landfill liner, or instance of human error have a high potential to allow toxic waste from the landfill to contaminate the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer; and


**WHEREAS**, contamination of any runoff from the landfill will flow directly into Nash Creek which flows into the Guadalupe River and could jeopardize public health, safety, and welfare for downstream users by polluting the drinking water supply, making the water unsafe for recreation and domestic animal use as well as for wildlife, and causing costly shutdowns of residential and industrial users of the river;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Guadalupe County Commissioners Court opposes the Post Oak Clean Green Landfill and any and all permits associated therewith.




